Friends of Black Mountain July 2021 to June 2022

Rosemary Purdie was awarded the ACT Government Citizen Scientist of the Year and Linda Beveridge was Highly Commended at the Landcare Awards this year.



For many years Rosemary has been sharing plant and ecology knowledge in citizen scientist surveys, work parties, guided walks, and the exhibition, *Black Mountain – a special place*. Rosemary was key in organizing the Black Mountain Symposium 2018, and was a co-author with lan Fraser of the very popular book, **Black Mountain** a natural history of a Canberra icon (2020).

We were grateful to receive a grant from Braysher Management Fund for the **Oral History of Black Mountain** project.

Many attended the **talk** featuring this project. Another very popular talk was "Fascinating Autumn Orchids of Black Mountain" by **Dr Mark Clements**.

Although wet weather reduced number of **Weeding Work Parties,** 47 people came to several of the 15 work parties, to remove more than 10,000 predominantly woody weeds

We held 11 **guided rambles**, led by 20 volunteers for almost 300 participants on themes of Spring Wildflowers, Butterflies, the Summit, Ngunawal and National Capital Cultures, Fire and Plants, and Orchids. Wildflower walk in the NE area of the Reserve recorded 117 species in flower; about 40 more species than last year.

Seventeen (17) **Frogwatchers** (including a Cub group), 8 **Vegwatchers**, and 7 **Bird Observers** provided data to related organisations.
